





Important Instructions for your Visit

Before your visit:

Please **read** the **Plain Language Statement** concerning the tests which will be conducted at the clinic visit and the **Consent form**.

Please try and avoid the following:

- (1) **Smoking** for **4 hours** before appointment time.
- (2) Long Acting Reliever Medication* for 12 hours before your appointment time.
- (3) Short Acting Reliever Medication* for 4 hours before appointment time.

*Refer to the last page for a medication list.

If you regularly use medication, please bring a list of those medications to your visit.

If you are a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or currently have any symptoms, including fever, cough, sneezing, sore throat or runny nose, please reschedule your appointment or call 1800 110 711 to discuss.

If you need to cancel or reschedule your appointment, please call to let us know as soon as possible.

How to get there:

Parking

- Car parking can be accessed via the Barker Street entrance.
- Parking is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- A private company, Point Parking, operates this service, fees apply.

Mobility parking

- There is limited free parking for people with a mobility disability.
- The free parking is located at the High and Barker street entrances, near the Catherine Hayes Building and outside Emergency.
- The spaces show the international symbol of access for people with disability.
- You must have a mobility parking permit on your vehicle to be allowed to park in these spaces.

Light rail

- The light rail service runs between Randwick and Circular Quay, via Central Station.
- The light rail platform at the Hospital is on the corner of High Street and Avoca Street.
